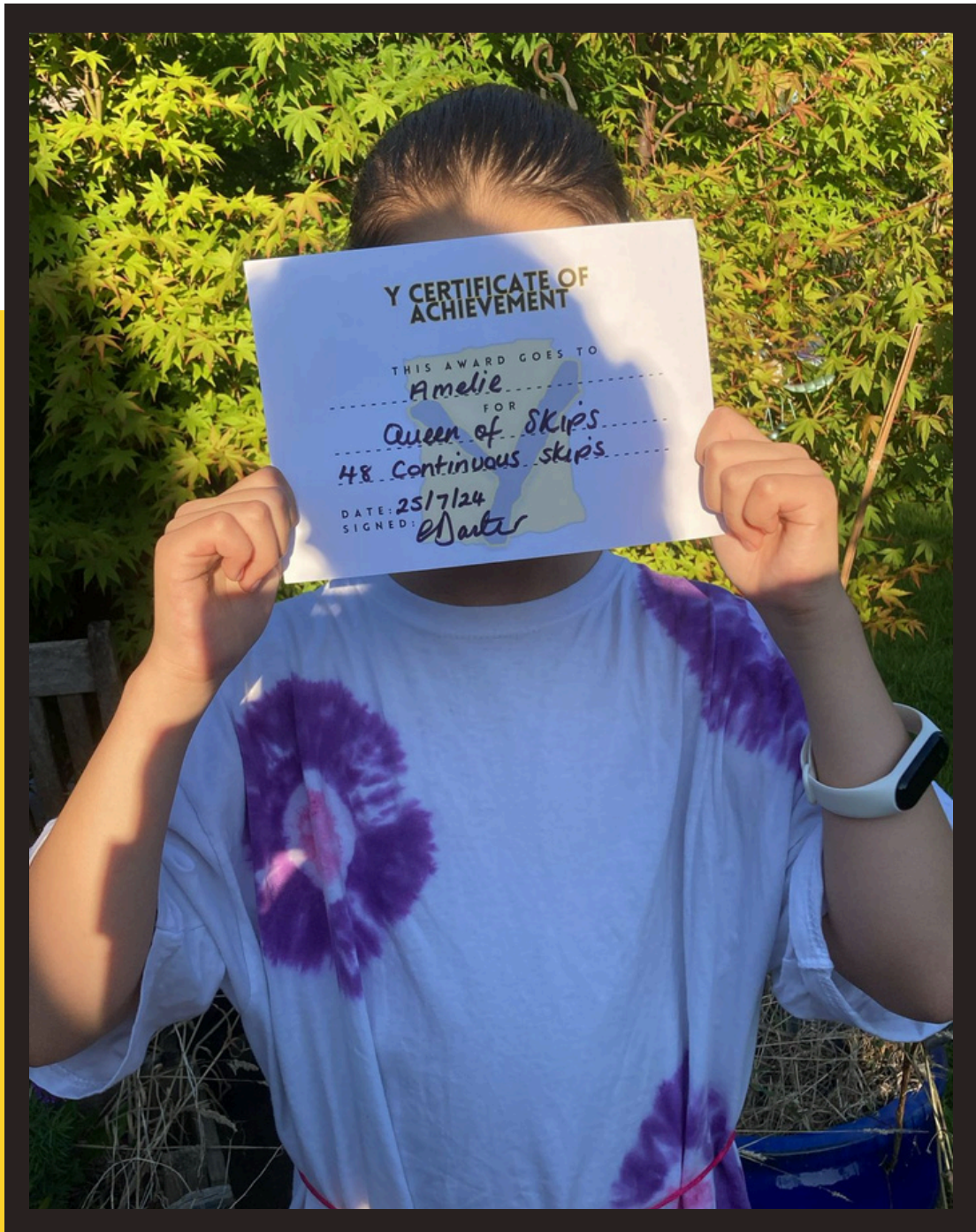

## PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

**Focus SEN Group** is our inclusive youth group for young people with Special Needs and Disabilities. The group takes place every Wednesday from 7pm to 9pm at the Genesis Centre, Locks Heath.

Each session is creative, comprehensive and varied. The programme is compiled by young people attending supported by staff, volunteers and partners.

Highlights of the Autumn programme include One Hit Wonder Day with karaoke and use of the music studio, celebrating World Mental Health Day creating stress balls and self-sooth boxes and a Christmas Party to end the term. Many sessions are supported with Asda Champions Heidi and Rachel, we are so grateful for their help and resource donations!



Focus recently had a powerboat experience with local charity WetWheels, an accessible boat provision. All group members were offered the chance to take part in a truly amazing experience. "We went so fast, the best bit was my driving." (Aiden 15)

Focus SEN Group offers a safe space for young people to engage with each other, where they can build their skills and meet with others.

Entry is £3 for Gateway card holders and £4.50 for non Gateway card holders. The club receives funding from Hampshire County Council as part of their Short Breaks scheme.

## DETACHED

The Detached Team have been busy visiting their regular areas talking to young people, plus, this summer, offering post-coding on bikes and scooters in local parks and open spaces.

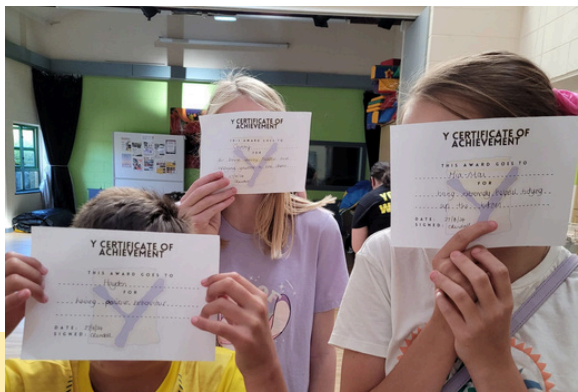
The purpose of detached youth work is to provide opportunities for personal and social development for young people and to create or reinforce positive lifestyles. Here is also the opportunity to challenge behaviour and attitudes so that young people are more open minded and aware of the impact that what they say, do and can have.



The team, led by Amy, cover Fareham, Gosport, Havant and Southern Parishes of Winchester in all seasons. Youth workers build trusting relationships with young people not engaging in youth services, and also those in more isolated and rural areas where services can be scarce.

The detached team also work closely with the Community Safety Partnership Team. Information on local hotspots is passed onto the teams who then visit these areas during their evening detached sessions, engaging with young people and seeking to resolve community issues or tensions. Feedback is given to partners on the impact of engagement and outcomes achieved.

## HAF ROUND UP

Summer saw our best HAF (Holidays Activity and Food) Project delivery yet! We spanned 4 sites and engaged with 124 individual young people throughout 104 youth work sessions making 811 attendances.

We had trips to Blue Reef Aquarium, Woodmill Kayaking and Top Rock climbing, Family Fun days, Bingo/Quiz nights and Colour Festivals. The sessions delivered a wide range of activities including fishing, inflatables, woodwork, bushcraft, reptile handling, textiles upcycling and we even had a Taylor Swift themed session!

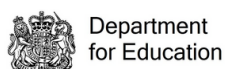
This summer we launched the Achievement Awards, giving young people an opportunity to receive a certificate for having a personal achievement within the session recognised by all attending. Well done to all recipients.

One family said “thank you so much, this is the only place she feels safe to attend on her own” (ASD female, 10 years). Another parent said “I would never be able to do activities like this over summer with my boys” (mother of three attendees).

We would like to say a massive thank you to all the team involved and especially to project lead Lorna, who made sure the project went like clockwork.

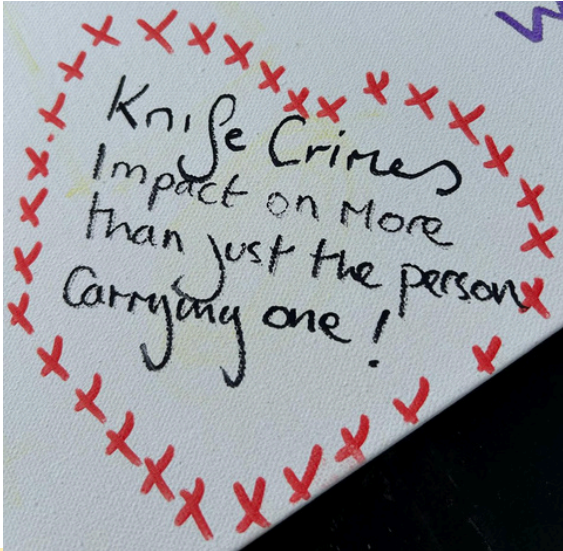

Y Services were asked to provide knife crime activities at local events recently, having issue based discussions and talking about the consequences of carrying a blade. Young people at Fareham's 999 Day and Gosport's Forton Fest were able to share messages on a giant canvass and talk about their experiences.



To celebrate Pride Month this year, Y Services LGBTQ+ groups created a giant cross-project art piece, a banner to use during the Pride March at the Portsmouth Pride event in July. Each project created a unique design with it's own story, this included hands, a frog and a unicorn. The group had a stand providing support signposting to Y Services projects.



We saw the welcome return of "Sean" the Y Bus after a brief hiatus with grateful thanks from Hampshire OPCC. The bus was present at the Daedalus 75 event where we welcomed many local families on board to make crafts and find out more about what we do. ## DEVELOPING WORK RELATED SKILLS

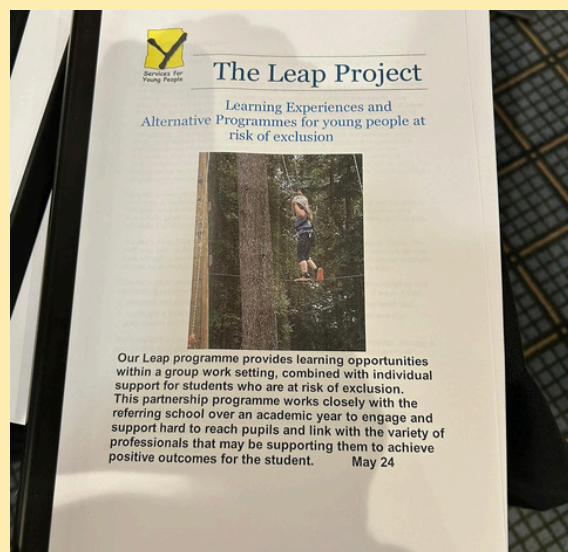
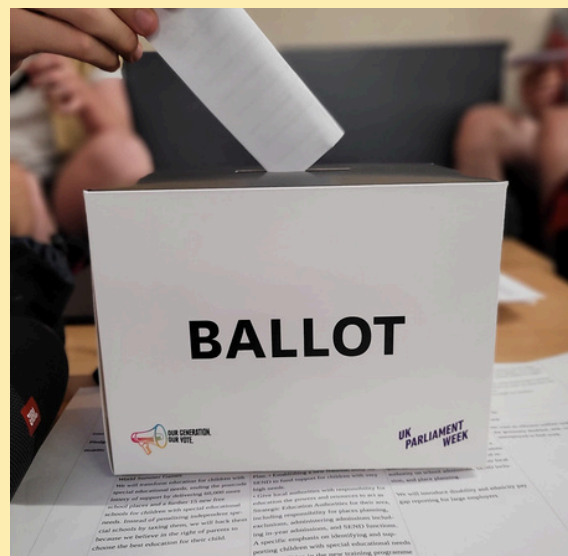
Y Services provides opportunities for young people to develop work related skills. K (pictured left) was a participant at two Y Services youth projects for a couple of years. At the age of 16 he was asked if he would become a young worker to help with a Friday night youth project. This gave K the opportunity to develop his confidence and skills with working with young people. At the age of 18, he completed his interview to become an adult volunteer for the charity and now supports two projects alongside his College course. We are thrilled that he has chosen to stay with the charity to gain further experience working with young people.

# CHARITY UPDATES

Y Services were extremely honoured to be asked to join Aviva to raise money to provide quality youth work and developing vital financial life skills. We absolutely smashed our £5000 target, with thanks to our supporters who donated and to Aviva Community Fund.

Over 100 young people took part in the “Our Generation, Our Vote” nationwide scheme prior to the General Election. Young people under 18 participated in conversations about politics, democracy and the issues that affect them. They cast their vote and results were sent to organisers who fed back to parties and broadcast of Sky’s FYI show to demonstrate the thoughts and views of children and young people.

The LEAP Project was launched at Portsmouth Alternative Learning Provision Conference. LEAP provides learning opportunities within a group work setting, combined with individual support for students who are at risk of exclusion.

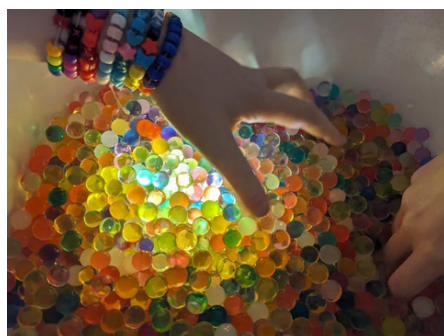
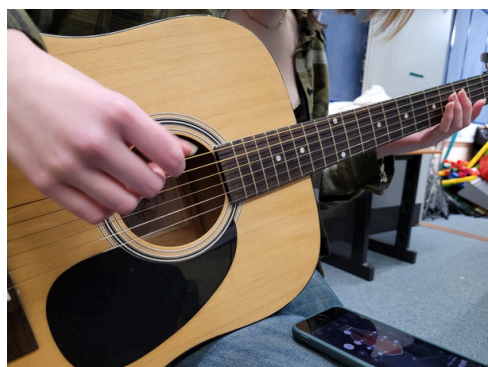
